Abstract: In the midst of COVID-19, the pervasiveness of racial inequities has become more pronounced. How do schools respond at this moment? What are the ramifications for this generation of students? In this talk, Professor Tyrone Howard will unpack some of the stark realities faced by students, families, and schools in this current moment, and discuss ways that education policy, practice and research can offer a formidable response.

Bio: Tyrone C. Howard is the Pritzker Family Endowed Chair in the School of Education and Information Studies at UCLA. He is the director of the UCLA Pritzker Center for Strengthening Children & Families, the UCLA Black Male Institute, and the UCLA Center for the Transformation of Schools. Professor Howard's research examines race, culture, and educational equity. Professor Howard was named an AERA Fellow in 2018.
